


KS3, GCSE, BTEC & A-LEVEL STUDENT STUDY RESOURCES

The Secondary Education resources cater for a broad age range: from KS3 students, to candidates for GCSE, Btec and A-level dance examinations. It is divided into three sections:

1. From Page to Stage: Creating CHARGE

Charts the creation of the work from the kernel of an idea through working practices to the emergence of the storyline and structure.

- the research
- the collaborative making process
- a time-line of the rehearsal period from research to premiere
- the production information





2. Under the Microscope: dissecting CHARGE

Guides the student scene-by-scene through the 'Arc' of the show by asking questions to hone observation, summarising significant elements to support an interpretation and suggesting analysis tasks and questions to deepen understanding and appreciation.

3. "Mad and Bad!" playing with CHARGE
