

# **SCENE 12: HEART**

#### **Heart Attack**

Are the dancers always in time with each other or do they move in and out of sync?

Which choreographic devices are used to show electrical disunity?

The dancers change their diagonal – why?

What is the effect created by the slapping of arms to sides?

What happens to the heartbeat in the soundtrack?

Who falls to the floor? Who runs to her? Do you recognise this image from earlier?

Naomi arches her back four times – what might this represent?

### Summary of meaning, mood and significance

A heart attack does not mean the heart stops. More often it means the electrical impulses that drive the pump action go out of sync. This is what the performers are showing us: from moving in perfect unison, they fall out of time and dance the heart attack of the daughter, Naomi, who falls away from the group. Her boyfriend runs to her and this is the image we have seen before at the end of Aerial Towers. Perhaps the memory of this traumatic event is often replayed in the mind and will remain one of the most enduring when other memories are being lost.

## Summary of meaning, mood and significance

The cameos merge sympathetically from the individualised grief of family members into the building of a giant heart contained within a projected filmic outline and pulsing in time with a strong, audible heartbeat.

The heart sculpture is built first in midair, then reforms on the floor. In between, the dancers move through a series of continuous free-flowing contact moments that dovetail one into another like blood through veins and arteries, or tears down a face.
